1. DIGITISATION

The digitisation is one of the major goals of the ENArC project. The realisation of this objective implies the cooperation between the project members and the interested institutions and archives. In this context the UNINA group launched a series of promising activities. The first stage is aimed at creating in the institution (especially archives) trust, commitment and adherence to the ideals of the project, the second at the promotion of activities of cooperation regarding digital archives, the last at the encouragement of further, autonomous digitisation activities on the part of the South Italian Institutions.

Below follows a table for each sub-project containing the institutions and the persons involved in financing and co-financing. "Financing" means proper financial contributions, whereas co-financing comprises the commitment of working hours of the employees of the institutions engaged in the cooperation.

3. ICARUS DIDACTICS WORK GROUP (ACTIVITY AND COORDINATION)

Didactics Workshop at Trinity College of Dublin

Dublin, 2013, June 25

During the Icarus Didactics Group Workshop presentations of recent didactic experiences using MOMCa and/or the portal Monasterium.net took place. After the introduction of the coordinator of workgroup, Antonella Ambrosio, there were two speakers on the didactics experiences of universities courses with MOM-CA: Daniel Jeller and Maria Rosaria Falcone.

1. Univ. of Vienna. Univ.-Doz. Dr. Adelheid Krah & Mag. Daniel Jeller

"Didactic actions at the University of Vienna and a reflection on future uses of new MOM-CA features for teaching"

The talk consisted of two parts. The first outlined the past lectures carried out by Mrs. Krah with assistance by Mr. Jeller starting from 2009 at the University of Vienna. One of the main points was the evolution of the used tools (MOM-CA, Fronter, Moodle, Wordpress). The second part focussed on the possible uses of current and future features of the Monasterium Collaborative Archive. The main point was the development of the "User collection" feature and its adaption as a tool for teaching.

2. Univ. of Naples Federico II. Prof. Antonella Ambrosio and dr. Maria Rosaria Falcone

"University of Naples Federico II. Teaching Experience of the Diplomatics Course 2012/2013"

The speech described briefly the didactic experiences with Diplomatics' courses at UNINA since 2008. Subsequently it reported on the educational path of the current academic year: This last course traced an educational path able to guide the students, starting from physical, direct knowledge of the charters, their archival and historic context and proceeding to their processing in a digital environment, thanks to the use MOM-Ca. The students worked on the collection of Monasterium.Net "Archivio virtuale del monastero dei SS. Petro e Sebastiano."

The workshop concluded with a fruitful exchange on the courses presented and on the courses that other members intend to start in the future. Finally two questionnaires about teaching and digital technologies were distributed (available soon also with the results online on ENArC UNINA website: http://www.recruitdigitaldoc.org/).

Sub-project. Virtual reconstruction of the archive of the convent Santa Maria della Grotta (600 charters ca.)

Organization phase, ongoing.

Goal

The sub-project aims at the virtual reconstruction of the archive of the convent of Santa Maria delle Grotte (Campania, Italy) for the centuries 11th to 15th.

The charters of this archive will be published at short notice within the Digital Archive of the Biblioteca della Società Napoletana di Storia Patria in Monasterium.Net, and as well as within a collection on the same portal. The digital editions will gradually be added.

Coordination: Antonella Ambrosio; Team: Maria Rosaria Falcone, Vera Isabell Schwarz-Ricci.

In october Antonella Ambrosio published a volume with the critical editions of parchments of the monastery Santa Maria della Grotta (11th-12th centuries).
